Project update

Welcome to our Spring edition

Spring is finally here! Welcome to all our new residents that have moved in recently. We hope you are settling in well.

We have lots going on this year! Over the next couple of months our landscaping team will be carrying out important health and safety works to trees across the estate to remove the dead wood.

By now our contractors will have started work on the final surfacing of the north footpath on East Hopes Grants Road. This work will also include remedials to the lighting infrastructure. Our contractors will also carry out improvements to ramps by dropped kerbs, on the estate, to ensure better access for residents in wheelchairs. If you spot an area that has been missed or that you have concerns about, please do email us info@wellesleyhampshire.co.uk. We are always happy to help.

Work continues on the Neighbourhood Centre, which will include a mini supermarket, a nursery, some commercial units, parking and a public square. We hope to have further information to share later this year.

We're delighted to confirm that Weston Homes will be purchasing the Aldershot Command Headquarters building opposite the play area. They intend to refurbish the building and convert it into 34 stunning homes.

We had the wonderful news that our playground has been shortlisted for a prestigious Golden Pineapple Award. The results will be announced at the beginning of April, so keep those fingers crossed!

Bellway Homes have now started to develop the areas of Stanhope West and School End which will include 260 homes and a large green open space for residents to enjoy.

We have shared initial plans of the Community Centre with the Wellesley Residents Committee, who gave us positive feedback. We have a little more work to do to ensure our proposals will work before we can share them with the wider community, but rest assured, we are working hard to deliver something that is fit for purpose, a place where residents will be able to join together for years to come.

Finally we plan to get the final road surface down on Hospital Road, Fire Station Road and East Hope Grants later on this year, ready for them to be adopted by Hampshire Highways. We will write to residents to let them know the exact timings and details.

We are planning to facilitate an update from Grainger on the development, including the neighbourhood center, in the near future - more details to be circulated with the next Wellesley Times.

Key focuses for the committee:

- 1) Crime - we continue to engage with the local police. Their advice remains to report all issues - receiving more reports will allow them to prioritise our issues more highly.
- 2) Management company issues - we are trying to work with management companies across the estate to ensure transparency of communication and finances (albeit with limited success). If you have any particular issues with management companies, please let us know.
- 3) Traffic/parking - we are working with Grainger and Wellesley Residents Trust to deal with traffic/parking issues. We are also applying pressure to developers to make good their areas of the estate - including ensuring that the development is fully accessible.

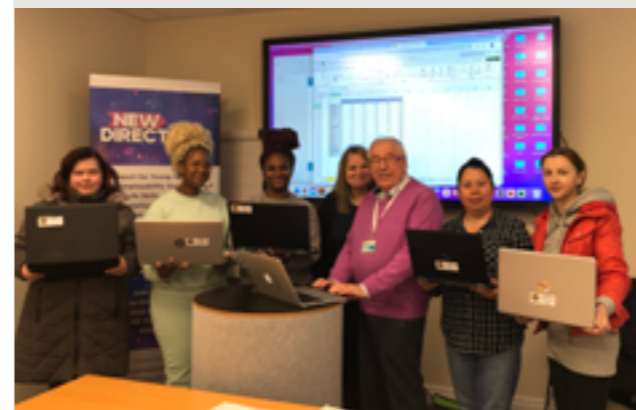

New Directions project trains participants in MS Excel

The New Directions project, based at the Aldershot Enterprise Centre, has launched a series of MS Excel workshops for women, using laptops donated by the local Lions Club. The project supports unemployed young women getting into work with 1:1 support and guidance and hosts a series of life and functional skills workshops to increase their chances of employability. The course was made possible with the donation of 8 laptops by the local Lions Clubs in Northeast Hampshire and it includes introductions to formatting and calculations, manipulating table data using maths and built-in formulae. Graham Drayton from the Lions IT Refurbishment Team comments: "The local Lions Clubs are proud to be involved in this scheme to empower women to be able to engage with modern communication methods. This puts into action our logo of 'We Serve'. Henriette Reinders, project manager for New Directions says: "The donation of the laptops enables us to provide in-person MS Excel workshops for our participants. Not only does it give them valuable employability skills it also increases their chances of employment. The New Directions project is funded by the National Lottery Community Fund. Give Peas A Chance (or why bread is bad for ducks!)

Traditionally, many of us fed bread to ducks, particularly stale bread we no longer wanted to eat, but in recent years it has become apparent that this seemingly innocent act is harming waterfowl and their environment.

While ducks may find white bread tasty, the danger is that they fill up on it instead of eating a natural, balanced diet, which can lead to serious vitamin deficiencies. Uneaten bread also causes algal blooms, allows bacteria to breed and attracts rats and other vermin. Feeding the ducks is a great activity for children, bringing them closer to the natural world and fostering a lifelong love and respect of wild animals, and we don't want you to stop doing it. However, along with The Canal and River Trust, we are asking you to do it responsibly.

The natural foods of our wildfowl friends (ducks, swans, geese, moorhens, coots, etc.) are things like pond weed, seeds, insects, worms, small water snails, amphibians and even crayfish.



These foods, rich in essential vitamins and minerals keep our feathered friends healthy. There are lots of common foods that are safe for ducks to eat instead of bread - raid your store cupboards for things like sweetcorn, defrosted peas, leafy greens, porridge oats, seeds, rice, and other whole grains. Most fruit and vegetables are safe (ducks can't chew so chop them up first) but there are a few foods to avoid as they are choking hazards or can lead to illness. These include crisps and other junk food, popcorn, cornflakes, acidic fruits and avocado.

Meet the Ranger



Hi, I am Nathan, the new Wellesley Woodlands Ranger (Acting).

I thought I would start with a little introduction. I studied Countryside Management alongside volunteering for National Trust at Winkworth Arboretum for 4 years. I then worked at the University of Surrey as a grounds person while helping improve the diversity of wildlife on campus. I joined the Blackwater Valley Countryside Partnership team in July 2022 as an Assistant Ranger and have worked on many sites including Wellesley, ultimately leading to becoming the Wellesley Ranger (Acting).

We have an amazing group of volunteers that are invaluable to help maintain sites along the Blackwater Valley, including Wellesley Woodlands. The team and I have achieved a lot in Wellesley over the winter, including digging new channels and ditches to drain water off paths and improve access.

In Puckridge, volunteers cleared invasive laurel blocking the ditch, which enabled us to excavate it with a digger and dry out the path. They've also been pruning vegetation at the Wellington Monument to allow people to see the statue from the bottom. This, combined with keeping the paths

clear, achieves a less enclosed space which is more welcoming to our visitors. Looking after Wellesley Woodlands is great as I get the opportunity to keep the area tidy and talk with our visitors and listen to their ideas. Please say hello if you see me out on site.

Aldershot Town Centre

All Aboard artwork launches in Aldershot Railway Station

The artwork, created by a University for the Creative Arts (UCA) graduate, is in the underpass between the platforms at the busy station and is part of a collaborative project between UCA in Farnham, Rushmoor Borough Council, Network Rail, South Western Railway and local signage company Reade Signs.

Created by Brianna Chartrand, a BA Illustration UCA graduate, the artwork depicts key heritage sites around Aldershot, including the Cenotaph in Municipal Gardens, Cambridge Military Hospital, and the Post Office building in the town centre. The design also features Nepali mandala patterns and poppies in tribute to Aldershot's role as the Home of the British Army.



New Enterprise Car Club launches at Union Yard

Eco Explorers Club Aldershot Town Centre

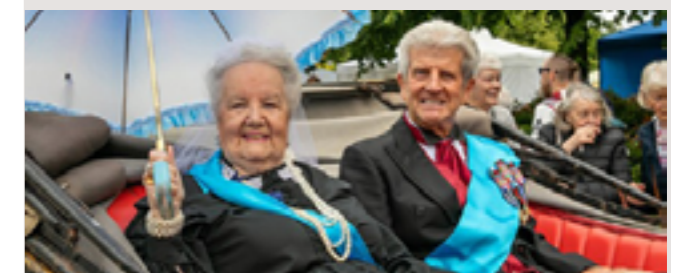

We can't wait to see what's in store this year!

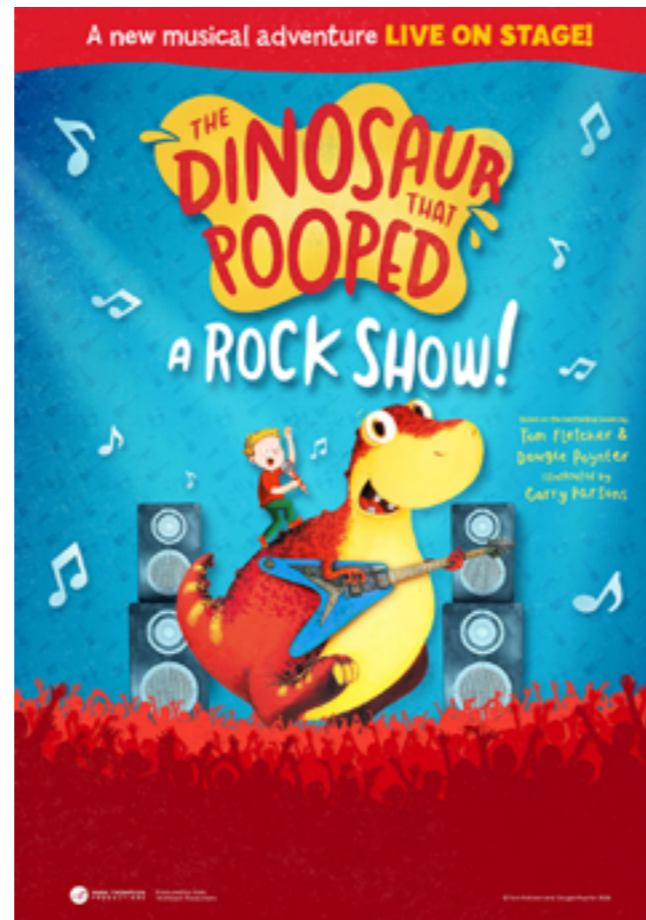
